February garden visit from Gaynor

We enjoyed our visit to Gilroy Rose Nurseries, at Clarkville near Kaiapoi on 27 February. The day was pleasant, and we had a fantastic tour of their rose nursery given by David Bryce, the owner of Gilroy Roses, who explained how he became involved in growing roses from growing the root stock to the end result. They grow roses mainly for Oderings and some other large nurseries in NZ. One of the main roses they grow is 'Iceberg' followed by 'My Mum' which are their biggest sellers. Even down here in Canterbury, they had been impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle due to the closure of Oderings in Napier which had been heavily impacted which meant cancellation of a large order they were about to send to them. However, despite this David was very positive, and he gave a wonderful description to us of the process of growing a rose from root stock to readiness for sale. His wife, Claire joined us later in the tour. Their house had been built for the original owners and along with the large red barn which was originally at the Great Exhibition in Hagley Park in 1916, had been on the property for many years.
