Ideally we would like to have everyone able to attend the monthly meetings but regulations at the Community Centre require us to limit the numbers. That said, we usually have between 10-120 members at our monthly meetings which is very good.

Helen Bickers, a critical care paramedic from St John was our guest speaker at last month's meeting. She gave a varied and at times amusing



talk about her work. She explained the various aspects of her uniform – the essential part being the

radio uniform with microphone and earpiece which is on permanently. This is a safely precaution as driving to an incident alone at night can be dangerous. She spoke of the Mosque shootings and said the whole episode was over in 90 minutes. Some St John staff from the Special Tactical Group earned bravery medals going into that situation along with the police. St John regularly practice for different scenarios and she said shootings and stabbings are becoming more frequent. Helen commended the St John case handlers who often have to talk people thought incidents and don't get to see the positive outcome. We were left feeling that St John does a wonderful job and we are vey grateful for their work.
